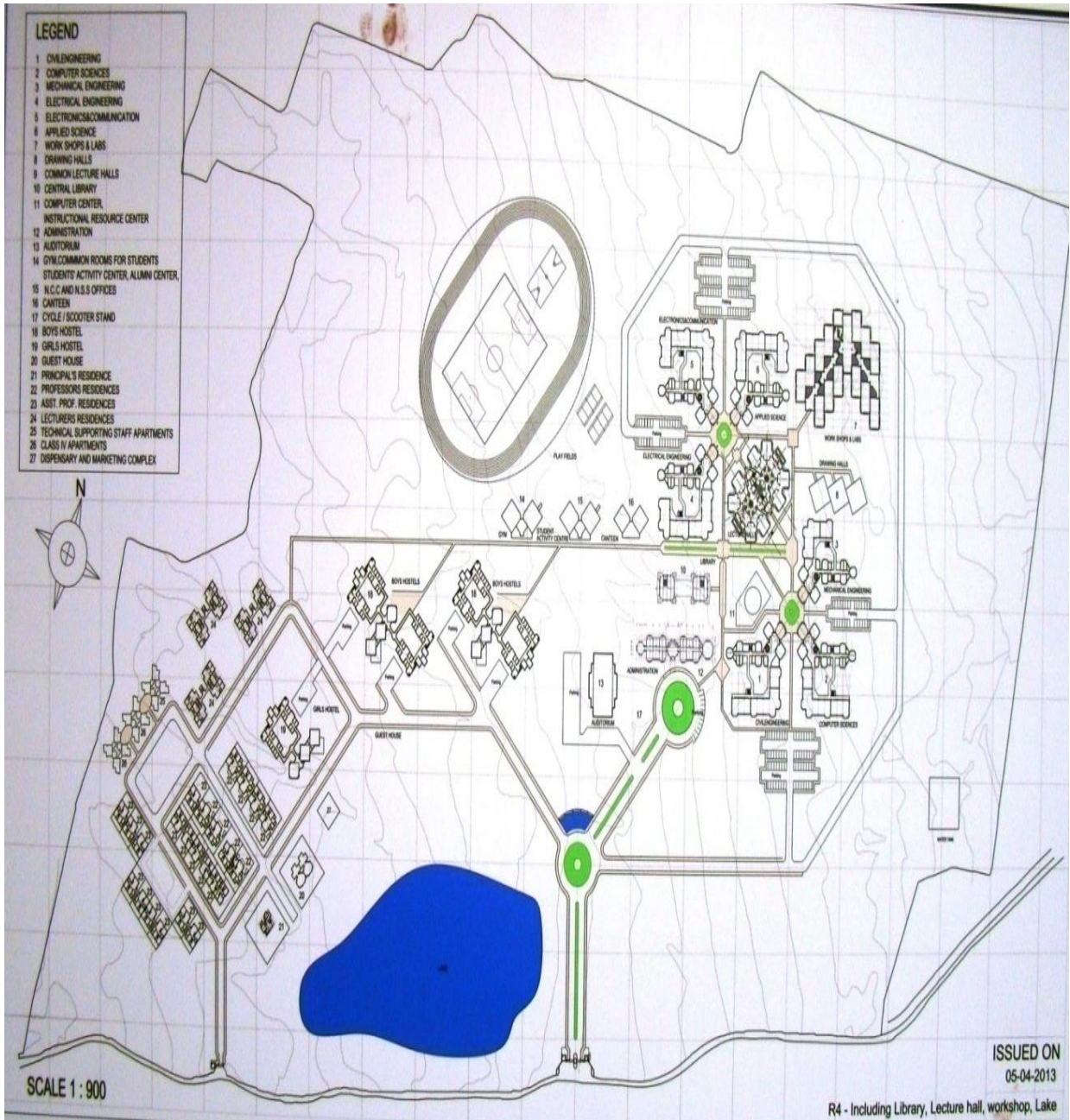

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INTRODUCTION

Government College of Engineering and Technology (GCET), Jammu was established by the Government of Jammu and Kashmir in 1993 with the approval of All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE) vide Notification No. : F-18-1/93-AICTE/910 dated: April 30, 1993 and is affiliated to the University of Jammu. It was created with the vision to provide valuable resources for industry and society through excellence in technical education and research. The campus is spread over 869 kanals of land at Jammu which is 22 kms away from Jammu city.

The Institute offers UG(B.E) Degree Courses in Electronics and Communication, Electrical, Computer, Mechanical and Civil Engineering with an intake capacity of 60 students per branch and PG(M.Tech.) in Computer Engineering, Electronics and Communication Engineering and Mechanical Engineering branches. Besides, the Institute also offers Lateral Entry Scheme in B.E. 3rd Semester with 10% of the sanctioned intake capacity, supernumerary to the approved intake in each discipline of Engineering. The Institute has well designed State of Art infrastructure with highly equipped labs in various departments. Besides, Central Computing Facility, each department has also well furnished computer lab.

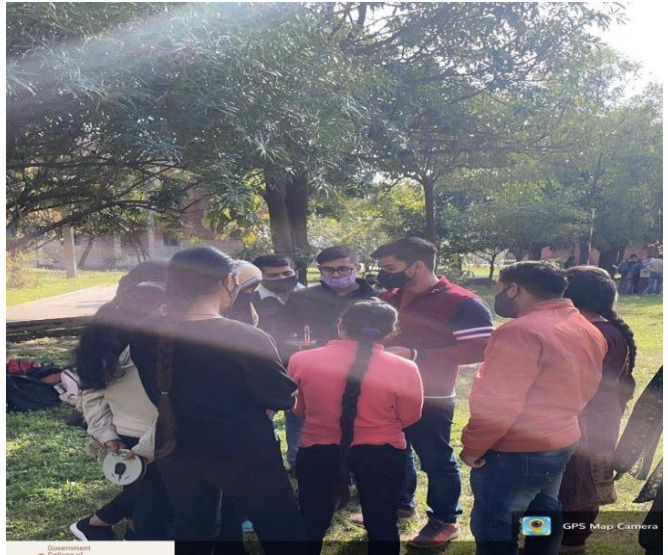

ADMISSION & GENERAL RULES

Selected candidates seeking admission in 1st Semester of 4 years B.E. Degree shall fill-up a printed application form available in the Institute.

Duly filled admission forms of all selected candidates shall be scrutinized by the Admission Committee constituted by the Institute on or before the notified date of admission by the BOPEE.

Selected candidates who do not deposit the requisite fee within the specified time in each list are liable to forfeit the right of admission and the seat will be referred to BOPEE for further filling-up from other eligible candidates as per merit list issued by BOPEE.

The candidates seeking admission must be accompanied by her/his father/mother/guardian at the time of admission as he/she shall have to sign the responsibility of his/her ward's conduct.

GENERAL RULES

- No outsider is allowed to enter the Institute without a valid reason.
- Unlawful assembly of the students in the Institute is not allowed.

- Writing of graffiti on the walls or sticking of posters is a cognizable offence.
- Students resorting to unfair means in any examination are liable to be issued a bad Character Certificate.
- Students shall park their vehicles strictly in the parking lot earmarked for students.

ADMISSION TO B.E. DEGREE COURSE UNDER LATERAL ENTRY SCHEME

Admission to B.E. Degree Course under Lateral Entry Scheme has been started since the year 2015. The candidates are directly admitted in B.E. 3rd Semester in all the Engineering Institutes affiliated to University of Jammu, after fulfilling the due criteria laid down for counselling/admission by the concerned University. Total seats available are 10% of the sanctioned intake capacity of each stream of the Institute and are supernumerary to the approved intake.

ELIGIBILITY

- i. The candidate who has passed
 - (a) Three years Diploma in Engineering and Technology from AICTE Approved Institute with atleast 50% Marks (40% in case of candidates belonging to reserved categories.
 - (b) B.Sc (Non Medical) from a recognized University as defined by UGC with 50% (40% for SC/ST) marks in aggregate and passed 12th standard with Mathematics as a Subject. Further, the students belonging to B.Sc (Non Medical) shall be considered only after filling the supernumerary seats with students belonging to the Diploma Stream. However, such

candidates shall have to pass the Engineering Mechanics, Engineering Graphics and Machine Drawing-I Courses of the B.E. Programme during their course of study.

- ii. Lateral Entry Engineering Test is conducted by University of Jammu, Jammu.

IDENTITY CARD

- i. Every student on being admitted shall be issued an Identity Card. He/She will have to carry it all times in his/her possession and shall produce on demand by any member of the Institute staff anywhere in the Institute premises.
- ii. The loss of Identity Card should be reported immediately.
- iii. A new Identity Card shall not be issued ordinarily. However, after proper verification/formalities, a duplicate identity card may be issued.
- iv. Identity Card must be returned after the completion of B.E. Degree.

CERTIFICATES

An outgoing student may obtain the following certificates from the Institute :

1. Provisional Certificate
2. Character Certificate
3. Institute Leaving/Discharge Certificate (if the student leaves the Institute mid-way).
4. Certificate of having appeared in the University Examination

Note :

- (a) Application for Certificate required should be submitted after completing all the formalities atleast three days in advance.
- (b) Certificate shall be issued only after the student produces a No Dues Certificate from all concerned Departments, Library, Security Officer etc. as mentioned in the prescribed form.

ANTI-RAGGING

RAGGING IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED IN GCET, JAMMU.

Ragging being a cognizable offence and Social Malaise is totally prohibited in the Institute.

Dress Code ragging, Formal introduction like in "Shudh Hindi", Verbal torture, Sexual abuse, Playing the fool, Hostel ragging, Drug abuse.

All Students are advised not to indulge in Ragging.

Ragging entails heavy fines, suspension and expulsion in addition to criminal prosecution in court of law.

PREVENTION and PROHIBITION OF RAGGING

Ragging is an offence punishable under law

Ragging Constitutes :

- (i) Conduct of student(s) by words (written or spoken) or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating a fresher student or any other student with rudeness.
- (ii) Indulging in rowdy, indiscipline activity of annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear / apprehension thereof.
- (iii) Asking student(s) to do an act having an effect of causing / generating a sense of shame/ torment / embarrassment and adversely affecting the psyche / physique of a fresher or any other student.
- (iv) An act that prevents / disrupts / disturbs the regular academic activity of a fresher or any other student.
- (v) Exploiting the fresher to complete academic tasks of senior students.
- (vi) Financial extortion / forced put expenditure on a fresher or any other student.
- (vii) Physical abuse including - sexual / homosexual assaults, stripping, obscene and lewd acts, gestures or bodily harm and danger to health of a person.
- (viii) Acts causing discomfiture to fresher's by way of spoken words, emails, posts, public insults and deriving perverted pleasure / sadistic / thrills from such acts by active / passive participation.

- (ix) Acts adversely affecting mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with the show of power, authority / superiority.

PUNISHMENTS FOR STUDENTS INDULGING IN RAGGING:

- (i) Cancellation of admission.
- (ii) Suspension from classes.
- (iii) Withhold / withdraw scholarship and other benefits
- (iv) Debarring from appearing in tests / exams / evaluation process.
- (v) Withholding results.

- (vii) Suspension / expulsion from hostel.
- (viii) Rustication upto 4 semesters.
- (ix) Expulsions from institution and debarring from admission to any other institution.
- (x) Collective punishment.

Note

- (i) In 1st Semester, an amount of Rs. 880/- shall be charged in addition to the actual fee as eligibility fee from the students who have passed the 12th Class Examination from other than JandK Board.
- (ii) The students seeking admission in the Hostel have to deposit Hostel and Mess Fee for the complete Semester in advance.

HOSTEL ACCOMMODATION

The GCET Boys Hostel, having a capacity of 200 students provides accommodation on merit basis. The students availing the hostel facility will be required to deposit the hostel fee and hostel mess charges in "Advance" for each semester as per details enlisted in the "Fee Structure". Further they have to follow the norms prescribed by the Institute for smooth functioning of the Hostel.

HOSTEL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Hostel accommodation is provided with the understanding that the resident student will strictly abide by the Hostel Rules currently in force or as may be enforced from time to time. **Accommodation in the Hostel cannot be claimed as a matter of right.** The Institute Administration may refuse accommodation to any student who is known to have grossly violated the Hostel Rules or whose presence is likely to disturb the peace and tranquillity of Hostel. Violation of Hostel Rules will make the student liable to disciplinary action including permanent expulsion from the Hostel. Students must remember that Hostel is the home of the student in the Campus and therefore, he should behave in the Campus as well as outside in such a manner as to bring credit to himself and to the institution. A student once admitted in the Hostel, will continue to be a hostel inmate throughout the year unless otherwise debarred from the Hostel on disciplinary grounds and he will have to pay the room rent for both the Semesters. Every student must be acquainted with all the rules and regulations of the Hostel. He must observe them strictly. Ignorance of rules will not be considered as an excuse.

1. Every student should stay in the room allotted to him. Mutual exchange of rooms after final allotment is not allowed. However, Hostel Committee may allow this as a special case on valid and reasonable ground. Violation of this rule will be considered an act of gross misconduct and entail appropriate disciplinary action including expulsion from Hostel and imposition of heavy fine.
2. Boarders must go through the Hostel Notice Board regularly. The Warden or any other authorised member of the institute staff can inspect the room of any student in the Hostel at any time. Hostel inmates are supposed to keep I-Cards with them and must present the same to any Hostel or Institute Authority whenever asked to do so. Students must always carry their Identity Cards with them.
3. No boarder should see the Principal for ordinary matters. Warden of the Hostel is the right person for such matters. In next step they can approach the Convener of the Hostel Committee.
4. All cases of illness should be reported to the Medical officer of the institute through the Warden or directly.
5. No student should keep any fire-arms, lethal weapons, poisonous things or intoxicants of any kind in the Hostel. Students must not take law into their own hands, but must report all disputes to the Hostel Warden. All kinds of shouting, fighting, gambling, stealing, violet knocking, maltreating or abusing are strictly prohibited. In such cases offender will be handed over to Police immediately.
6. The boarder shall have to vacate accommodation as and when asked by the authorities. All the boarders shall vacate the Hostel rooms before they leave for the summer vacations so that annual repairs and white wash is carried out. All the Hostel articles issued to the students are to be returned to the caretaker before the students leave their rooms. They will be responsible for any loss.
7. No boarder is allowed to engage a private servant or keep pet animals.
8. Students shall not remain absent from their Hostels during night hours without the prior permission of the Warden.
9. Hostel students shall not leave the Campus without prior permission of the Warden. They shall have to apply in advance stating the reason for leaving and the address of destination. Hostel students who leave the Hostel without permission from the Warden shall be deemed to be missing and Parent/Guardian/Police authorities may be intimated in consultation with the Principal.
10. The inmates of the Hostel will not leave the Hostel premises on holiday for the purpose of Excursion or picnic. Prior permission of the Warden has to be obtained for going for any Picnic or Excursion. However, for any eventuality that may occur during Picnic/Excursion., the responsibility does not lie with the Institute authority.
11. Hostel inmates are supposed to take care of their health themselves. Student suffering from infectious disease has to leave for medical treatment to proper Clinic/Hospital or isolated place.

12. Formation of association/club of students on the basis of regions, religions, caste or creed is not permitted during their stay in the Hostel.
13. Room furniture and electric fittings are required to be maintained by the inmates in good condition. At the time of allotment of room and leaving the Hostel for the Summer Vacations, every student must take over and hand over, respectively, the Hostel property carefully. Students should vacate the Hostel during Summer Vacations.
14. In case of damage to any part of the Hostel buildings, furniture, apparatus or other property of the Institute, caused by inmates of the Hostel, the loss shall be recovered from the persons identified as responsible for such damage. However, if the person causing damage cannot be identified, the cost of repairing the same as may be assessed will be distributed equally amongst all the inmates of the Hostel or group of inmates of the Hostel found responsible for the damage.
15. Students should lock their rooms properly when they go out for bath, food etc. Each roommate must keep a key of the door lock of his room in case of double/triple seated accommodations.
16. Every student residing in the Hostel must join the Mess. Individual cooking is not permitted. They are not allowed to cook anything in their rooms.
17. Every inmate of the Hostel shall pay the Mess bill and other charges as per the notified schedule. The approved rules regarding Mess will be applicable to all inmates of the Hostel. Mess regulations shall be binding on the boarders of the Hostel. The regulations for Mess can be amended at any time even during mid-session for the smooth running of the Mess facility.
18. Ragging in any form is a cognizable offence and severely punishable as per the Supreme Court directives leading to expulsion from the Hostel and the disciplinary action may culminate in his expulsion from the Institute as well. The Institute administration may report incidents of ragging to the Police for taking appropriate action under the law.
19. Penalty for violation of Hostel rules will be decided by the Hostel authorities considering the severity of the offence/violation of rules/act of indiscipline.
20. Guests are not permitted to stay overnight in the room of the students. A boarder keeping a guest in his room is liable to be fined.
21. Students are prohibited from giving shelter to any other student/outsider in the rooms. In case of any unauthorized shelter, the student will be liable to disciplinary action.
22. Resident students are not permitted to invite any outside person to address any meeting in the Hostel without written permission of the Principal.
23. Light must be switched off when not in use. The use of electric heater, electric rod, ACs and other similar appliances are prohibited. Boarders are warned against tampering with electric installation and for all electric repairs the electrician should be called in.
24. Students in their own interest, are advised not to keep excess cash or any valuables in their Hostel rooms. They are cautioned to be very careful about safety of their belongings. They should close their rooms securely when they

leave the room even for short periods or when they are sleeping. Institute shall not be responsible for the loss of such items due to theft or otherwise. However, in the case of theft, the matter should be immediately reported to the Warden and security Officer of the Institute.

25. Students are prohibited from consuming alcoholic drinks, drugs, cigarettes, tobacco products or any other intoxicants inside the Hostel or to enter the Hostel after consuming the same. Any student found consuming such things or in a drunken state in the Hostel will render himself liable for strict disciplinary action, including expulsion/ rustication from Hostel/Institute.
26. Students are prohibited from screening/keeping obscene literature/ video films in the possession. Any violation in this regard will result in disciplinary action.
27. Allotment of rooms to the students shall be made for an academic year.
28. During the failure of power supply or outage the backup supply through the Generator Set will be provided from 08:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. During emergency/examination hours the duration of backup/Generator Set supply shall be changed as recommended by the Convener Hostel Committee from time to time. Any Hostel boarder found creating violation/nuisance during power failure shall be liable for strict disciplinary action including expulsion/rustication from Hostel.
29. In case of Wi-Fi/Internet failure within the Hostel premises, the Hostel inmates shall immediately bring the matter to the notice of the Warden. The Warden will take up the matter with the concerned authority. If any Hostel inmate is found creating commotion for the same, strict disciplinary action shall be taken against the concerned person.
30. Every student shall be responsible for the safety of furniture/other articles given to him. Furniture neither to be removed from the room nor carelessly kept outside the room. Anybody indulging in this practice will be liable to a fine Rs. 200 per article.
31. acts of indiscipline misbehaviour, gambling, violations of hostel rules, use of intoxicants in the hostel premises shall be liable to expulsion or a fine of Rs. 500 or both.
32. Roll No. for any examination or provisional certificate etc. shall not be issued to Students unless to produce 'No Objection Certificate' from his hostel Warden.
33. Cooking in the room is strictly prohibited and defaulters shall be fined of Rs. Each time.
34. No meals will be served/taken in the room except in cases of severe illness as permitted by hostel Warden.
35. Hostel and mess fees will be charged semester wise means six months in advance from all the boarders in the following manner:
 - (a) Odd semester in the month of July/August or at the time admission.
 - (b) Even semester in the month of January.

B.E. STATUTES

(STATUTES GOVERNING THE DEGREE OF BACHELOR OF ENGINEERING (CBS) notified by the University of Jammu from the Academic Session 2018-19.

1. There shall be a 4 year Bachelor's Degree Course in Engineering (hereinafter referred to as B.E Degree Course) comprising the following eight academic semesters :
 1. B.E 1st Semester
 2. B.E 2nd Semester
 3. B.E 3rd Semester
 4. B.E 4th Semester
 5. B.E 5th Semester
 6. B.E 6th Semester
 7. B.E 7th Semester
 8. B.E 8th Semester

The maximum time duration to complete the B.E Degree Course will be 8 years. If a candidate fails to complete the B.E Course within 8 years, his/her registration for B.E Course shall stand cancelled.

- 1.2. The Academic Calendar as given in Appendix be adopted in B.E statutes. The academic year comprising a capsule of two semesters (odd and even) shall normally commence in the first week of August each year.
- 1.3. The examination for the B.E Degree Course in Engineering shall be conducted in the following disciplines:
 - (a) Civil Engineering
 - (b) Mechanical Engineering
 - (c) Electrical Engineering
 - (d) Electronics and Communication Engineering
 - (e) Computer Engineering
 - (f) Information Technology Engineering

1. **ADMISSION**

- 1.1 Admission to the 1st Semester of 4 year B.E. Degree Course shall be open to candidates who have passed 12th class examination under 10+2 scheme with English, Physics and Chemistry (Science Group) from J&K State Board of School Education or any other examination conducted by a University/State Board of Secondary Education recognised as equivalent thereto with not less than 50% marks in aggregate in the qualifying examination in respect of open category and 40% marks in aggregate in SC/ST and other categories. The admission shall be made on the basis of Common Entrance Test conducted by the Board of Professional Entrance Examination of the State Govt. for the purpose.
- 1.2 Depending upon the number of vacancies approved by the **UT** Government Authorities from time to time; Diploma Holders with a minimum of 60% marks in the aggregate in any branch of Engineering from any State Board of Technical Education recognized by the All India Council for Technical Education (A.I.C.T.E.) shall also be eligible for admission directly to the 3rd Semester of the 4 year B.E. Degree Course based on the Common Entrance Test to be conducted by the University of Jammu under **Lateral Entry Scheme**. The total number of seats under this category shall be 10% of the total sanctioned strength (Branch wise) in that year. These seats shall be however, over and above the normal sanctioned strength. The admission of the eligible candidates under reserved categories in B.E 3rd semester through Lateral Entry Scheme to various disciplines of engineering shall be made as per the reservation rules of UT Government.
- 1.3 Admission made by the Institute shall remain provisional till such time the eligibility of the candidates admitted is approved by the University.
- 1.4 The Admission to 1st Semester of 4 year B.E. Course shall normally be made on or before the 15th of August each year and that the academic programme of the students shall commence on 16th of August or from the next working day if 16th August happens to be a holiday.
- 1.5 The Vice-Chancellor may in exceptional case, on the recommendation of the Principal, permit late admission to a candidate on payment of late fee as may be prescribed by the University from time to time within a period of 30 calendar days from the date of examination.
- 1.6 Any student studying in an Engineering institution affiliated to a recognized University, on the recommendations of Dean, Faculty of Engineering be allowed to migrate by the Vice Chancellor, to the University of Jammu on fulfilment of the requirements prescribed hereunder :

- (i) Not more than one student in each discipline shall be allowed migration in an academic year, provided there is a prior approval of the **UT** Government for such additional quota of seats.
- (ii) The migration shall be allowed to a student who has been admitted through a **UT** or National Level Entrance Test or a test conducted by any agency approved by the State Government for this purpose.
- (iii) The migration shall be permitted in 3rd Semester only. The equivalence of courses covered by the student in 1st and 2nd Semester shall be established by the Dean, Faculty of Engineering. Any backlogs determined there of shall have to be cleared by the candidates within permissible chances as per the University rules.

2. MINIMUM ATTENDANCE

2.1 Regular examination of each semester shall be open to a candidate who fulfils the statutory conditions and his/her name is recommended by the Principal of the concerned Institute to the Controller of Examination alongwith the relevant certificates like medical, sports etc.

2.2 Candidates having <75% attendance in maximum of two courses (Theory/Practical) shall not be allowed to appear for final University examination in that particular course/courses, if attendance <75% in more than two courses (Theory/Practical) the candidate shall be detained for that particular year.

3. CONDONATION OF ATTENDANCE

3.1 The Principal of the Institute shall be competent to condone shortage on genuine grounds upto 15% of the total number of class attendance in each semester. Student whose attendance falls short by more than 15% or whose deficiency is not condoned by the Principal shall not be permitted to appear in the examination and shall have to enrol herself / himself as a regular student of the Institute in the subsequent year in the semester in which she/he has failed to fulfil the attendance requirement.

3.2 ATTENDANCE IN LIEU OF PARTICIPATION IN GAMES ETC.

Any candidate who participates in games, cultural and other co-curricular activities as defined below with the prior approval of the Principal concerned shall, for the purpose of condoning deficiency in attendance on account of such participation, be treated as present on all the working days during the days of his absence on such account for a period not exceeding 15 working days in a Semester Programme.

- a) UT representation in International/All India Competition organised by agencies which are organised by the Board of Sports and Youth Welfare.
- b) Participation in the Inter-University Competition held under the auspices of any other recognised Institution as a member of the University team.
- c) Participation in the Inter-Institute Competition organised by the University as a Member of the team of Participating Institution.
- d) Participation in the NCC, NSS and National Integration Samiti activities as a member of recognised Institution.
- e) Participation in the Coaching Camps/Rehearsals prior to participation as member of **UT** or University team in the National / All India / Inter-University Competitions.
- f) Participation in the Mountaineering / Hiking / Trekking / Skiing / Rock - climbing or other such activities organised under the auspices of the **UT**Government/University as a member of the Institution affiliated / recognized by the University.

4. AUTHORITY FOR PRESCRIPTION OF COURSES OF STUDIES

The syllabi and courses of study for each subject shall be approved by the Academic Council on the recommendations of the Dean, Faculty of Engineering.

5. DATES FOR SUBMISSION ON FORMS

5.1 Candidates shall fill up their examination forms prescribed by the University for seeking permission to sit in an examination within 45 days (for 1st Semester) and 30 days (for II to VIII Semesters) from the last date of admission, without late fee to the semester concerned of the College and also pay the requisite examination fees on the dates to be determined by the Principal.

5.2 The forms together with the fees as prescribed by the University from time to time shall be sent to the Controller of Examination by the Principal of the College two months preceding the date of examination of a Semester Programme. Wherever the examination forms/fees are received after the prescribed last date, the College shall be liable to pay a late fee as may be prescribed by the University from time to time per candidate per day.

6. SCHEME FOR EXAMINATIONS

6.1 The examination for various Semesters consisting of written papers and sessionals shall be held as per Academic Calendar of Institute / University.

6.2 The medium of instructions as well as examination for the Degree shall be English.

6.3 HOLDING OF SUPPLEMENTARY EXAMINATION

During the course of one academic year, Regular Examination for theory papers for odd semesters i.e. 1st, 3rd, 5th & 7th shall be held during December/January and for even semesters i.e. 2nd, 4th, 6th and 8th shall be held during May/June as per academic calendar, whereas, examination for re-appear/backlog shall be held alongwith regular examinations. There shall however, be special supplementary examinations in B.E. for 5th to 8th Semesters.

7. PASS PERCENTAGE

- 7.1** The credit based UG curriculum in Engineering for all B.E courses as per the new AICTE model curriculum has been adopted from the session 2018-19 and onwards. In view of the credit system the evaluation shall be on the basis of Grade and Grade points and shall be finally reflected as semester Grade point average (SGPA) and cumulative Grade point average (CGPA). The CGPA can be converted to equivalent percentage by multiplying CGPA by 9.5. The minimum marks required to pass in each course examination of any semester shall be 40% (Grade D) in theory examination and sessionals separately; provided that a candidate who appears in all the courses of a semester and fails in only one course (theory part only) by not more than 3% of the maximum marks allotted to that course shall be deemed to have passed the examination. Provided also that this concession shall not be granted in the sessionals and to a candidate who passes the theory courses of examination of a semester in parts.
- 7.2** A candidate shall be declared to have passed in a particular course, if he/she marks in theory, sessionals for that course are less than 40% (Grade E). In that case, the student shall be allowed one or more chance to reappear in the sessionals alongwith the regular students of same semester. His /her sessionals will thereafter be communicated to the Controller of Examinations alongwith the regular students.
- 7.3** A candidate shall be declared to have failed in a laboratory course if he/she secures less than 40% (Grade E) in a particular laboratory course. Such a candidate can clear the backlog only when such a laboratory course examination will be available.
- 7.4** The evaluation of Sessional marks in the theory papers of all the semesters shall be based on the following distribution:

(i) Class Test	40%
(ii) Class Assignments	40%
(iii) Class Attendance	20%

The marks out of 20% for regularity in attendance shall be awarded according to the following scale :

(a) Below 75% of the total number of attendance	Zero
(b) From 75% to 85% of the total number of attendance	60%
(c) Above 85% to 90% of the total number of attendance	80%
(d) Above 90% to 100% of the total number of attendance	100%

Two compulsory class tests shall be held in each course will equal weightage of marks for each class test. However, if a candidate is unable to appear in any of the two tests conducted because of the genuine reasons may be given one more chance by the Principal on the request of the candidate.

7.5 The evaluation of Sessional marks in the laboratory courses shall be based on the following distribution.

(a) Lab. Work (Continuous Assessment)	50%
(b) Viva-voce test	30%
(c) Attendance	20%

The marks out of 20% for regularity in attendance shall be awarded according to the following scale:

- i) A student obtaining Grade E shall be considered failed and will be required to reappear in the examination as per existing rules of the University under CBS for Under Graduate Courses.
- ii) Grade (D) or percentage of marks (40%) is required to pass in a course, SGPA of 6 to qualify a semester and a minimum CGPA of 6 to qualify for a UG Degree.

Note: The CGPA can be converted to equivalent percentage by multiplying CGPA by 9.5.

8. NON ENTITLEMENT FOR ACADEMIC AWARDS

Candidates having passed the theory papers in supplementary examination by a repeat performance in any semester examination shall not be eligible for any academic award of Distinction, Prizes and Medals.

9. ENTITLEMENT FOR ACADEMIC AWARD

Gold Medals/Awards etc., shall be awarded by the University each year in accordance with the regulations made there under at the time of convocation to the candidates securing first position in order of merit of CGPA in each discipline and one to the overall topper. In case of tie(s) in CGPA the total percentage obtained by the candidate in all the semesters taken together shall decide the award as per merit.

10. PROMOTION FROM ONE SEMESTER TO ANOTHER

Promotion from one semester to another semester i.e. from 1st semester to 2nd semester, 2nd semester to 3rd semester and so on shall be automatic. Provided that a candidate shall not be allowed to attend classes in the next higher semester unless he/she has appeared in the examination of immediate preceding semester.

11. The internal sessional award/marks shall be submitted to the controller of examinations within 15 days after the completion of University B.E End semester examinations.
12. A candidate who has been enrolled for the B.E Course shall be admitted to the B.E Degree only when she/he has been declared successful in the examinations of all the semesters in accordance with the above Statutes.
13. The overall grade card shall be issued on payment of such a fee as prescribed from time to time a student who has completed the B.E Course and has been declared successful in the semester examination in conformity with above statutes.
14. The rates of fee payable for admission to the examination of the 4 year Bachelor of Engineering course and rates of the remuneration for the various assignments shall be such as may be prescribed by the University, from time to time.

15. AUTHORITY TO INTERPRET STATUTES

With a view to remove any difficulty or anomaly arising out of the application and implementation of these Statutes, the Vice-Chancellor shall be competent to give authoritative interpretation of these Statutes and his interpretation shall be final and binding on all the concerned.

STATUTES GOVERNING THE DEGREE OF POST-GRADUATE PROGRAMME IN ENGINEERING :MASTER OF TECHNOLOGY (CBS)

1. Title

- 1.1 These regulations shall be called “**Regulations Governing the Credit Based System**” for Post Graduate Programme in engineering “from the academic session 2020-21. In short, it will be referred to as “**JU(PG) CBS REGULATION IN ENGINEERING**”.
- 1.2 **Scope, Application and commencement**
The regulations shall apply to all the Master of Technology programme in relevant branch of Engineering and Technology hereinafter referred to as M.Tech, offered by the Institutes Affiliated to the University of Jammu under the ambit of the Faculty of Engineering from the academic session 2020-21. The learning and evaluation is on semester based pattern. Provisions under these regulations hereby supersede all the existing regulations for the regular postgraduate programmes in engineering offered by the affiliated Institutes to the extent prescribed herein.

2. DURATION

- 2.1 The course for the degree of M.Tech programme shall be spread over a period of two years comprising semesters I, II, III and IV. The maximum period of completion of the programme including dissertation work shall not exceed four academic years. The programme of instruction will consist of Core courses, Elective courses and Dissertation work.
- 2.2 In any case the candidate has to clear all the prescribed courses of M.Tech within a maximum period of four years to be calculated from the date he/she is admitted to the M. Tech program.

3. ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS and ADMISSION CRITERIA

- 3.1 The candidate applying for admission to M.Tech programme must be either:
 - i) B.E/B.Tech (in relevant branch of engineering and technology) with 50% of the marks or equivalent CGPA.
 - ii) MCA/M.Sc (Computer Science/IT/Electronics/Mathematics/Statistics/Physics) in case of M.Tech in Computer Science and Engineering, Electronics and Communication Engineering and allied domains, with 50% of the marks or equivalent CGPA.

All the above-mentioned degrees should be from Institutes/Universities recognized by UGC/AICTE. A relaxation of 5% in marks in the qualifying examination shall be given to the candidates belonging to the categories of

Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) as mentioned in Statute-5. This relaxation shall not be applicable to private affiliated Institutes.

- 3.2 All the candidates seeking admission to M.Tech should have a valid GATE score. The GATE score of two years will be valid. The admission shall be strictly based on the score obtained in GATE.
- 3.3 In the absence of having adequate number of candidates with valid GATE score, the University of Jammu shall conduct its own written/online test for admission to the said programme. Admission shall be based strictly on the merit obtained in the entrance test.
- 3.4 In case two or more candidates score the same score in written entrance test, their inter-se-merit shall be determined on the basis of percentage of marks in the qualifying examination. In case of a tie even at the qualifying examination, the decision for admission shall be taken by the admission committee headed by Dean Engineering, University of Jammu on the basis of other academic credentials. The decision of the committee shall be final and binding on the candidate.
- 3.5 A candidate appearing in the final year of the qualifying examination in April/May of immediately preceding academic session can also apply for admission to **M.Tech** only if he/she furnishes documentary evidence in support of his/her having passed the qualifying examination in full on or before 31st of July, or such other date as may be approved by the Dean Academic Affairs, University of Jammu; failing which his/her candidature shall automatically stand cancelled and the seat thus becoming available shall be filled in accordance with the merit.
- 3.6 The candidate should be a Domicile of JandK UT.

4 NUMBER OF SEATS

Open Merit Seats:

- Total number of seats, including the categories, in M.Tech in all the Engineering Institutions Affiliated to University of Jammu shall be as per approval from the All India Council for Technical Education AICTE (the statutory body governing technical education in the country), Government of UT of JandK and University of Jammu.
- Implementation of reservation rules shall be as per, Reservation rules of UT of JandK.
- Fifteen percent (15%) management quota for private Institutes shall be applicable as per norms in vogue for other PG programs.
- Fifteen percent (15%) seats shall be reserved in Govt. institutions for in-service employees who may be deputed by their respective employing organizations.

The Institute may admit persons, who are in gainful employment as 'Sponsored Students' to any of the courses covered by this regulation subject to the conditions laid down in following paragraphs, such candidates are exempted from GATE examination:

- An applicant seeking admission as a sponsored candidate must have obtained degree at the qualifying examination.
- He/she must have secured at least 60% marks or equivalent CGPA in Bachelor's degree examination in Engineering and Technology.
- He/she must have had a standing of at least 2 years' service ,while applying,
- He/she shall have to produce sponsorship and No Objection certificate (NOC) from the employer.
- Intending sponsored candidates must submit their application on prescribed form for admission through their employers, forward the same to the Dean, Faculty of Engineering, University of Jammu with suitable endorsements as required by the stipulated date. In the case of a sponsored candidate ,the maximum age limit shall be as decided by their sponsoring employer.
- In case the number of applicants to an institution under sponsored category are equal to or less than the available seats, the admission shall be made based on interview by the Admissions Committee constituted by the Dean, Faculty of Engineering, University of Jammu. Otherwise, all sponsored candidates shall be required to appear in the entrance test, conducted by the University of Jammu and managed by the Dean, Faculty of Engineering, University of Jammu. Admissions shall be based strictly on the merit obtained in the entrance test. At the time of joining the Institute, a sponsored candidate selected for admission shall be required to produce certificate in a prescribed form from the employers to the effect that the applicant
 - i) Has been in service in that organization for at least a period of 2 years.
 - ii) Has been officially released from duties for purpose of joining the course and his/her service will be retained with the employers. The selected sponsored candidate shall have to submit evidence of having passed the qualifying examinations with required percentage of marks or grade and other necessary documents as the Institute may require.
- The total open merit and reserved category or management seats should not exceed the total sanctioned intake in any case.

Note: Reservation shall not be applicable to private Institutes as per norms in vogue.

5. ENTRANCE TEST

The entrance test, if required, shall be designed and conducted by the University of Jammu. However, all the pre-conduct work of the Entrance Examination such as receipt of online application form, counseling of candidates, issuance of admit cards of Entrance Examination to the candidates, date of test, model test paper, syllabus and other details shall be notified and managed by the Dean, Faculty of Engineering.

6. ADMISSION PROCESS

- 6.1 The Dean, Faculty of Engineering, University of Jammu shall issue notifications published in at least one local newspaper calling for applications for admission to the M.Tech program, specifying the eligibility conditions etc.
- 6.2 Application form prescribed by the committee constituted by the Dean, Faculty of Engineering, complete in all respects, and accompanied with the attested photocopies of the certificates specified there in must reach the Dean, Faculty of Engineering within the dates notified for the purpose.
- 6.3 Every candidate seeking admissions to M.Tech. shall be required to pay application fee (Non-refundable) as may be determined by the University from time to time. Remittance of all fees shall be made through Bank Draft/digital payments.
- 6.4 An applicant, who seeks admission under reserved categories as mentioned in statute 5, must attach with Application Form an attested photocopy of the appropriate certificate issued by the competent authority and an affidavit (Annexure) from first class magistrate, failing which candidature under the reserved category shall not be considered. The certificate of being beneficiary under the categories reserved is advised to be implemented as per the reservation rules of UT of JandK. It shall not be considered if it is not in conformity with the latest order, issued for the purpose, by the JandK UT. Applicants to private affiliated Institutes are not required to submit category-related certificates.
- 6.5 The allotment of seats shall be made by the Admissions Committee constituted by the Dean, Faculty of Engineering, University of Jammu on the basis of valid GATE scores obtained by the applicant candidates. Valid GATE scores of three years shall be used to resolve and determine inter se merit of candidates having same GATE score; following criterion will be used in the stated order of preference:
 - i) Candidates having valid GATE score in last to last preceding year will be given preference over candidate having score in the preceding year/current year and preceding year will be given preference over candidate having score of current year.

ii) If years of GATE score are also same then the candidate with more experience will be given preference.

iii) In highly unlikely event of equality of their experience i.e. same duration of experience the candidate who was born earlier as compared to other candidates with tie will be given preference.

The committee may hold up to two rounds of counseling to admit GATE qualified candidates.

- 6.6 For the remaining seats, the allotment shall be made by the Admissions Committee constituted by the Dean, Faculty of Engineering, University of Jammu on the basis of the rank list published, based on score in the University of Jammu Entrance Test and availability of seats. The admission shall be on the basis of counseling and the committee shall hold up to two rounds of counseling and thereafter allot admission to candidates, to all available seats in various Government/Private Engineering degree Institutes.
- 6.7 During counseling, the candidate is required to appear in person along with relevant documents.
- 6.8 In case some seats are still left vacant, the case shall be referred to Dean Academics, University of Jammu for filling the vacant seats.
- 6.9 At the time of admission the candidate has to submit the provisional certificate in original or affidavit if the gap between the last qualifying examination and the date of admission is more than one year.
- 6.10 Names of candidates selected for admission shall be notified from time to time on the Notice Board or the specified website by the Dean, Faculty of Engineering. The selection may be cancelled, and no complaint shall be entertained in case of non-compliance of instruction(s) through such Admission Notices.
- 6.11 Admission fee and other charges payable by each student shall be such as approved by the competent authority/University of Jammu from time to time.
- 6.12 Notwithstanding anything contained above, a candidate, who has any grievance regarding application of Statutes governing admission, shall have the right to file an appeal in the prescribed Performa on payment of fee prescribed for this purpose latest by the 2nd of September each year or such other date as may be notified by the University of Jammu for the purpose. Such an appeal may be considered by the Appellate Committee based on its merit. It shall be obligatory for the appealing candidate to appear in person before the Appellate committee. The decision of the Appellate Committee shall be final and binding.

- 6.13 The Admission Committee constituted by the Dean, Faculty of Engineering shall have authority to refuse or cancel admission of a candidate who either:
- i. fails to produce any requisite certificate in original within the time prescribed; or
 - ii. suppresses/conceals any relevant information, provides information in his/her application which is found incorrect or produces a certificate which is not genuine; or
 - iii. fails to pay the fees and other charges within the time prescribed.
- 6.14 No certificate/document/affidavit or its attested photocopy shall be accepted after the expiry of the date prescribed for submission of Application Forms for admission with late fee.

7. MINIMUM ATTENDANCE

- 7.1 Regular examination of each semester shall be open to a candidate who fulfils the statutory conditions and his/her name is recommended by the Principal of the concerned Institute to the Controller of Examinations along with the relevant certificates like medical, sports, etc.
- 7.2 Candidates having attendance <75% in maximum of two courses (Theory/ Practical) shall not be allowed to appear for final University examination in that particular course/ courses; if attendance <75% in more than two courses (Theory/ Practical) the candidate shall be detained for that particular year.

8. CONDONATION OF ATTENDANCE

- 8.1 The Principal of the Institute shall be competent to condone shortage on genuine grounds up to 15% of the total number of class attendance in each semester. Student whose attendance falls short by more than 15% or whose deficiency is not condoned by the Principal shall not be permitted to appear in the examination and shall have to enroll herself/himself as a regular student of the Institute in the subsequent year in the semester in which she/he has failed to fulfill the attendance requirement.

8.2 ATTENDANCE IN LIEU OF PARTICIPATION IN GAMES ETC.

Any candidate who participates in games, cultural and other co-curricular activities as defined below with the prior approval of the Principal concerned shall, for the purpose of condoning deficiency in attendance on account of such participation, be treated as present on all the working days during the days of his absence on such account for a period not exceeding 15 working days in a Semester Programme.

- a) State representation in International/All India Competitions organized by agencies which are recognized by the Board of Sports and Youth Welfare.
- b) Participation in the inter-university Competitions held under the auspices of a University or any other recognized Institution as a member of the University team.
- c) Participation in the Inter-Institute Competitions organized by the University as a member of the Team of Participating Institution.
- d) Participation in the N.C.C., N.S.S. and National Integration Samiti activities as a member of recognized Institutions.
- e) Participation in the Coaching Camps/Rehearsals prior to participation as a member of State or University Team in the National/All India/Inter-University Competitions.
- f) Participation in the Mountaineering/Hiking/Trekking/ Skiing/Rock-climbing or other such activities organized under the auspices of the State Government/University as a member of the Institution affiliated/recognized by the University.

9. SCHEME FOR EXAMINATIONS

- 9.1 The examination for various Semesters consisting of Written papers(Theory External) and Internals shall be held.
- 9.2 The medium of instructions as well as examination for the Degree shall be English.
- 9.3 There shall be no supplementary examinations for M.Tech program. However, there shall be a provision of re-evaluation of answer scripts at the discretion of the concerned student.

10. PASS PERCENTAGE

- 10.1 The minimum marks required to pass in each theory course examination of any semester shall be 40% in theory examination and internals separately; provided that a candidate who appears in all the courses of a semester and fails in only one course (Theory part only) by not more than 3% of the maximum marks allotted to that course shall be deemed to have passed the examination. Provided also that this concession shall not be granted in the internal exam and to a candidate who passes the theory courses of examination of a semester in parts.
- 10.2 A candidate shall be declared to have passed in a particular course, if he/she has secured 40% marks in External theory and 40% marks in internal exam separately. If a candidate has secured 40% marks in theory but has failed in internal exam shall be declared to have failed in internal only and if a candidate has secured 40% marks in internal exam but has failed in theory shall be declared to have failed in theory only. The pass marks secured by the candidates in theory and internal shall be carried forward. The failure

candidates will be allowed to appear in the subsequent examination/s of that course as and when is/are held.

- 10.3 A candidate shall be declared to have failed in a laboratory course if he/she secures less than 40% in a particular laboratory course. Such a candidate can clear the backlog only when such a laboratory course examination will be available.
- 10.4 The evaluation of Internal marks in the theory papers of all the semesters shall be based on the following distribution:

13. PROMOTION TO NEXT SEMESTER and AWARD OF DEGREE

- 13.1 Promotion from one semester to another semester i.e from 1st to 2nd semester, 2nd semester to 3rd semester and so on shall be automatic.
- 13.2 A candidate who has been enrolled for the M.Tech Course shall be admitted to the M.Tech Degree only when she/he has been declared successful in the examination of all the semesters in accordance with the above Statutes.
- 13.3 Transcript of marks for all the four semesters shall be given in a composite form on payment of such a fee as prescribed from time to time to a student who has completed the M.Tech Degree Course and has been declared successful in the Semester examination in conformity with above Statutes.

13.4 The rates of fee payable for admission to the examination of the 2 years M.Tech Course and rates of the remuneration for the various assignments shall be such as may be prescribed by the statutory fee fixation authority from time to time.

14. AUTHORITY TO INTERPRET STATUTES

14.1 All legal disputes related to the M. Tech programme shall be subject to the jurisdiction of Courts at Jammu

14.2 Interpretation, if any shall be determined by, the Vice-Chancellor, University of Jammu in consultation with the Dean, Faculty of Engineering and the decision taken shall be final and binding on all concerned.
